THIS HAZARDOUS WEATHER OUTLOOK IS FOR SOUTH TEXAS (Kleberg County).

DAY ONE...TODAY AND TONIGHT

SCATTERED SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WILL BE POSSIBLE ACROSS SOUTH TEXAS TODAY AND TONIGHT. SEVERE THUNDERSTORMS ARE NOT EXPECTED AT THIS TIME.

THERE IS A HIGH RISK FOR DANGEROUS RIP CURRENTS TODAY AND TONIGHT ALONG GULF FACING BEACHES.

A COASTAL FLOOD WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR MINOR TO MODERATE TIDAL OVERFLOW AT TIMES OF HIGH TIDE.

DAYS TWO THROUGH SEVEN...SATURDAY THROUGH THURSDAY

THUNDERSTORMS ARE EXPECTED SATURDAY THROUGH TUESDAY OVER SOUTH TEXAS. VERY HEAVY RAINS...POSSIBLY LEADING TO FLASH FLOODING...WILL BE POSSIBLE WITH AN INCREASING POSSIBILITY SATURDAY THROUGH SUNDAY MORNING. IN ADDITION...AN ISOLATED TORNADO MAY BE POSSIBLE SATURDAY AND SATURDAY NIGHT ACROSS EASTERN PARTS OF THE AREA.

ISOLATED TO SCATTERED THUNDERSTORMS WILL ALSO POSSIBLE MONDAY THROUGH TUESDAY...MAINLY ACROSS EASTERN PARTS OF THE AREA.

A MODERATE TO HIGH RIP CURRENT RISK IS EXPECTED DAILY THROUGH THE WEEKEND AS PERSISTENT MODERATE TO STRONG EAST TO SOUTHEAST FLOW INCREASES SWELL PERIODS AND SWELL HEIGHTS IN THE GULF OF MEXICO.
