## TEXAS WATER DEVELOPMENT BOARD GRANT AWARDS – DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

City of Kingsville submitted <u>four(4)</u> grant applications to the Texas Water Development Board(<u>TWDB</u>) on November 5, 2020, under the Flood Infrastructure Fund(<u>FIF</u>) <u>program. The The associated dPrainage Improvement projects</u> for Locations 1, 3, 4, and 7 <u>listed below. The applications</u> requested a total of \$6,024,000.00 for drainage improvements pertaining to the <u>adopted adopted 2018</u>. Kingsville Master Drainage Plan <u>adopted in 2018</u>. On April 22, 2021, the City of Kingsville was notified by the Texas Water Development Board that it was awarded grants (42%) and 0% loans (<u>5355</u>%), which includes construction cost, <u>Engineering engineering</u> fees, and approximately 3% local funds. <del>The drainage improvements include the following:</del>

The projects aims to increase community resiliency by reducing economic loss from inflow and infiltration into the wastewater collection system, protecting public investment in community-owned facilities, minimizing environmental impacts of hazards, reducing obstacles to a timely and safe evacuation of hazard areas, preserving public and private emergency response capability, and minimizing disruption to utilities.

The drainage improvements include, in no particular scheduling order the following:

- Master Drainage Plan Location 1 Fairview Drive
  2,400 LF of drainage system, 16 each inlets, channel excavation and pavement repairs
- Master Drainage Plan Location 3 21<sup>st</sup> Street
  2,800 LF of storm drain, 10 each inlets, and pavement repairs
- Master Drainage Plan Location 4 Alexander Avenue
  3,100 LF of storm drain, drainage channel excavation and pavement repairs
- Master Drainage Plan Location 7 Pasadena Drive
  2,900 LF of storm drain, 17 each inlets, channel excavation and pavement repairs

The project aims to increase community resiliency by reducing economic loss from inflow and infiltration into the wastewater collection system., protecting public investment in community owned facilities, minimizing environmental impacts of hazards, reducing obstacles to a timely and safe evacuation of hazard areas, preserving public and private emergency response capability, and minimizing disruption to utilities.

Construction is expected to begin in Spring, Fall 2022 and completed within one year. The Texas General Land Office funds can only be used for drainage improvement as show in the <a href="map-exhibit">map-exhibit</a> below.
